OUR ANNUAL IMPACT 2024

159 new migrants/refugees/ people seeking asylum are in pathways to financial independence.

61 new migrants/refugees/ people seeking asylum participated in **The Space2b Experience**.

26 Participants had work opportunities, improved their skills and leadership capability through our Space2work program. 90% are in paid work.

32 Entrepreneurs were supported in product and business development through our Space2Fly program. 14 now sell at Space2b.

90 migrant & local artists were supported through our gallery and art programs.

105 Designers are selling their unique creations through Space2b's retail outlet. Around 56% are CALD.

18 Experienced and skilled mentors supported our participants.

46 Hardworking, committed volunteers help us make Space2b, the space to be.

18,100 People attended our Festivals, events, and workshops.

2,708 Estimated Volunteer hours in a year.

\$127,106 Volunteer financial annual contribution.



Space2b is unique in Melbourne. The team at Space2b have a depth of knowledge in the artisanal and small business space and they take real joy in sharing this knowledge. Their organisation is also shaped by the lived experiences of refugees over many years. When they engage and work with community, they bring all of this experience to the table. Participants are provided with examples, demonstrations and guidance and can see a path forward to turning an idea into a creative and beautiful small enterprise. The fact that Space2B is also a functioning gallery and retail space means that the pathways to growth and sustainability are also real.

Our unique buddy system pairs new migrants with a volunteer. Each pair train and work together, fostering inclusion, connection and cultural understanding, creating a healthier and more accepting society.

This year 18 skilled mentors supported and worked together with our participants.

Space2b is all about connections. Our fully inclusive model permeates every aspect of our business to provide opportunities for the local community to connect with new migrants and refugees.

Our programs also benefit the local volunteers, giving them the opportunity to engage and connect with refugees, whilst gaining work experience, skills and references.



OUR WORK

1. SPACE2FLY: FOR ENTREPRENEURS

In 2024, our retail shop featured 105 artisans, including 56 culturally diverse makers and 49 local established artisans.

This year our business mentors supported 32 new emerging entrepreneurs.

PRODUCT DESIGN AND BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

Space2Fly is our personalised mentor and training program in art, design and business development. It supports participants to become creative business owners & entrepreneurs. Developed with and for newly arrived creatives, this program is a platform to generate connections, get real life work experience, and work side-by-side with established designers.

Space2Work provides that vital opportunity for newly arrived migrants to work and train together with local residents in a safe and welcoming environment.

We know there is a growing need for tailored employment support that provides comprehensive work ready skills, English language skills, and supported on-the-job training for unemployed migrants, refugees, people seeking asylum and international students.

The program offers placement opportunities in a range of different areas in our enterprise, such as sales and marketing, retail and customer service, accounts and stock control, gallery management and event management.

When our participants are 'work ready', they are placed with our partners for further training and paid employment.

Our 4th annual **Affordable Art Show** supported 49 Artists with over 100 works of art from photographs to sculptures.

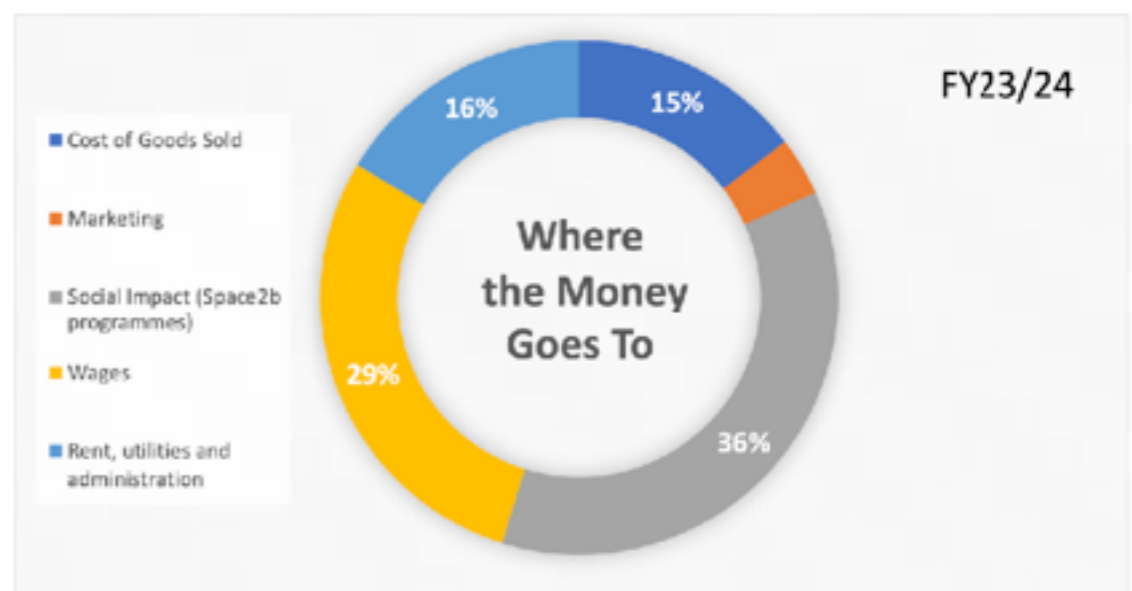
FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS 2023–24

The 2023-24 financial year delivered positive results for Space2b as we grew across all areas of the enterprise.

We continue to run a profitable and sustainable business with healthy cash on hand and no long-term debt.

Here's some highlights of our financial performance:

- Our overall income grew by 24.6%
- A major contributor to our income growth was our 10th anniversary gala which resulted in over \$15,000 in donations and over \$10,000 in event revenue
- Our strong growth in grants from the prior FY was maintained as we grew our grants and subsidies from \$157,000 to \$169,000 which will enable us to commit to more strategic multi-year programmes
- Shop sales were flat in line with general retail trends however we were able to reduce the cost of sales resulting in a 9.2% increase in retail profitability
- We continue to invest in our management and staff to retain and attract talent and build capability to deliver better programmes and as a result, our wage bill increased 34.8%
- Thanks to our amazing volunteers who contributed 340 days of their time, delivering \$127,106 of social value to the business
- We made a modest operating surplus for the year which contributed to \$121,953 of funds on hand

WHAT'S AHEAD

Looking ahead to 2025, Space2b will continue to focus on two major initiatives which are aligned to our Strategic Goals.

STRATEGIC GOALS

1. To build the Space2b brand
2. To increase our impact
3. To achieve financial sustainability

These initiatives will help us to continue to expand and work towards financial sustainability, while bringing Space2b artists and their work into new partnerships for the benefit of both parties.

1 Business Development & Corporate Gifting

Thanks to generous two-year funding from Westpac, we continue to grow our Corporate Gifting Program. With guidance from two dedicated Westpac mentors and a team of specially selected experts, we are expanding our reach and impact, creating meaningful opportunities for artisans while strengthening corporate partnerships.

2: Corporate Art and Cultural Experience

In 2023, we successfully piloted our *Corporate Art & Cultural Experience* with Community Bank Windsor. This unique program offers businesses, government agencies, and NGOs a dynamic, art-based team-building experience featuring cultural performances, awareness talks, and exclusive dining at our Laneway Café. Building on this success, we plan to run a second pilot in 2025, with a full launch scheduled for mid-year.

3. Art Auction Fundraiser

Exciting plans are underway for our very first *Art Auction* in May 2025! This event will welcome professional artists and art lovers alike, with the goal of raising \$10,000 to support our creative programs.

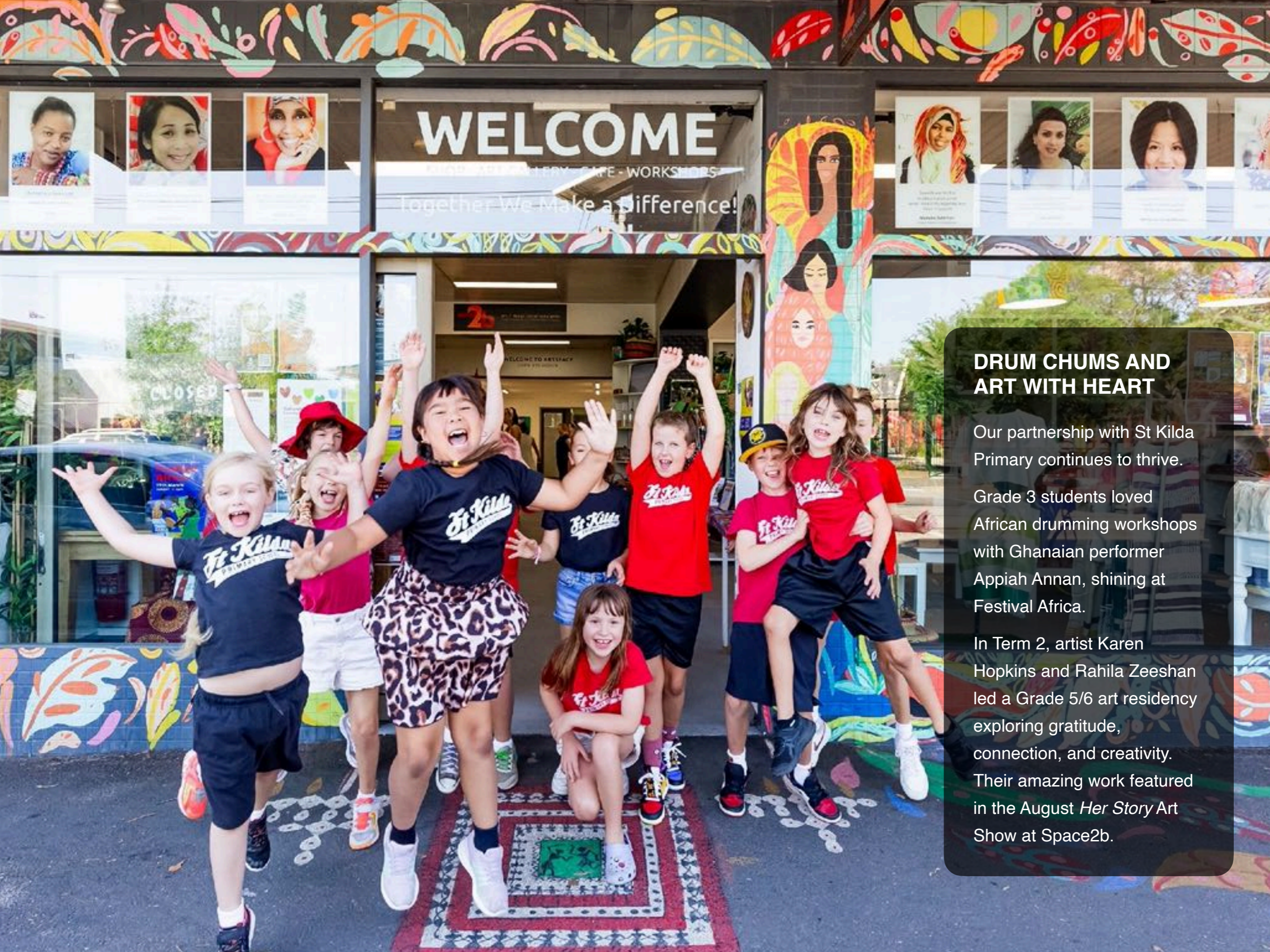
